Four Free Concerts at **Old Orchard**

For the sixth summer season, Old Orchard shopping center in Skokie will present a series of free Monday evening concerts featuring famous performers. This summer series opens

with the Serendipity Singers tomorrow night, July 22, followed by Woody Herman July 29, George Shearing Aug. 5, and Ramsey Lewis Aug. 12,

The concerts are staged on an octagonal structure with a brightly lighted wrought iron roof canopy reminiscent of the Gay 90s, called "The Gazebo," Names such as Stan Getz, Louis Armstrong, Peter Nero and Phil Ford and Mimi Hines have performed here for crowds of from 15,000 to 25,000.

Threatening weather or no, the show will go on. Old Orchard audiences are a stouthearted bunch, and Roger Williams played to dripping thousands from under his ample umbrella in August of 1966,

The Old Orchard sound system sends the music live and loud to the stage area, the malls, the farthest corners of parking lots, and even onto Edens Expressway.

Old Orchard pioneered the free concert idea in 1960 and was the first shopping center to offer big name falent to audiences completely free of charge,
