MUZ-hack / Joni Mitchell Charles Mingus

Charles Mingus is a late, great, jazz bassist who recently died of cancer. But before he died, he collaborated with Joni Mitchell for a final statement. Perhaps his worth can be summed up with a quote from the album's inner "Charles Mingus, a musical mystic, died in Mexico, January 5, 1979, at cremated the next day. The same day, 56 sperm whales beached themselves on the Mexican coastline and were removed by fire. These are coincidences that thrill my imagination.''

In an attempt to preserve Mingus' character, Mitchell has interspersed personal tapes of Mingus in informal set-

tings. Those used on side one add little effect to the music and are hard to decipher in the party-like atmosphere.

The first song on the album is Mitchell's "God must be a Boogie Man," a poke at the almighty God and the cruel joke he played on his only begotten son, Jesus. The music is in a spacey, 1940's jazz club style, as is most of the age of 56. He was the album. 


