



JoniMitchell.com Transcription for Baritone Ukulele

John Hardy

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DGBE, 'Joni' Tuning: x545, Capo 2

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Played on Baritone ukulele.

Tuning (low to high): DGBE

Joni tuning: D545

Capo at 2nd fret

(So with capo on, open strings are EAC#F#).

You can play this song very easily on a guitar in standard tuning (with capo at 2nd fret) using just the top 4 strings.

Chord shapes

There are only 4 chord shapes used in the song:

B/F#	2220
Bsus2/F#	2200
E	0232
F#m	2000

For simplicity I'll just write B and Bsus2 in the transcription, instead of B/F# and Bsus2/F#.

On most of the chords the picking-hand thumb typically alternates between 3rd and 4th strings, with the strumming of the higher strings done with the fingers, but this alternating thumb pattern is not followed absolutely strictly throughout the song.

The example tab below shows how this works (use of the thumb is indicated by ^ underneath the tab).

On the B chord:

Intro

Note that the alternating thumb pattern on 3rd/4th strings doesn't get going properly until the verse. It's also worth noting that in this intro sections, the B chords sometimes alternate with Bsus2 (with one extra open string) and sometimes with F#m (with two extra open strings). It sounds as if Joni doesn't follow a strict pattern and will sometimes interchange use of Bsus2 and F#m shapes.
